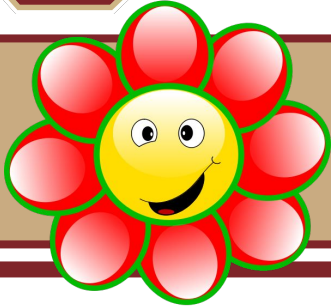
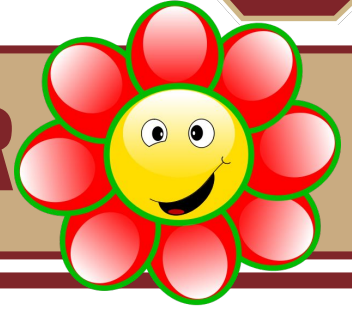

5th Grade News

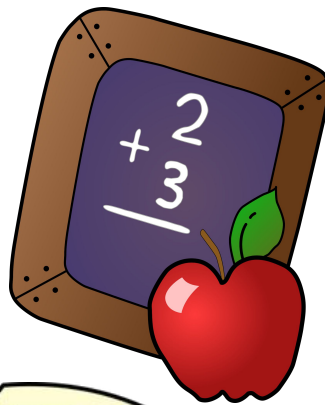
As we approach the last quarter of the school year, please continue to look at your child's agenda and sign it daily. Ask your child if they need pencils for class. Working together, we can build good habits for a lifetime.

Parents, you can help your child build confidence and fluency in reading by reading with your child daily. Take turns reading to model fluency and discuss what you have read to increase comprehension. The NYS ELA test will be held on April 29th and 30th.

Daily practice of basic math facts is a must. All students should know their facts with automaticity. This means that they can immediately give an answer without counting on their fingers. Many students still struggle with money. Having your child count change is another great skill to work on at home. The NYS Math test will be held on May 6th and 7th.

In Social Studies, students are concluding their study of the Age of Exploration. They will be moving on to the colonization of North America leading up to the Revolutionary War. Stay tuned for information on a field trip in June that will bring their studies to life.

In Science, the fifth graders are finishing up their study of matter and are moving on to the patterns of Earth and sky. With the warm weather approaching, take the opportunity to observe the stars on a clear night. Students should be able to explain why we have a daily pattern of day and night and why the stars appear to move across the sky.



6TH GRADE

Math

Our 6th graders have been working hard and are gearing up for the New York State Math Test this spring! In class, we've been reviewing key concepts like fractions, ratios, geometry, and problem-solving strategies. Students are practicing how to show their work clearly, explain their thinking, and tackle multi-step word problems with confidence. You can help at home by encouraging your child to practice math facts, complete homework carefully, and talk through math problems to strengthen their reasoning skills. A good night's sleep, a healthy breakfast, and a positive mindset on test day will help them feel ready to succeed!

ELA

As we head into spring, our 6th graders are getting ready to take the New York State English Language Arts (ELA) test. This test is an opportunity for students to show what they've learned in reading, writing, and critical thinking. The ELA test measures students' skills in reading comprehension, vocabulary, and writing. Students will read both fiction and nonfiction passages and answer multiple-choice and short-response questions. They'll also write longer responses, explaining their ideas with evidence from the text.

How We're Preparing in Class

In school, students are practicing:

- **Close reading strategies** to understand texts deeply
- **Answering text-based questions** that require evidence
- **Writing clear, organized responses**
- **Building stamina** for longer reading and writing tasks

Social Studies

Our current unit is focusing on the Roman Empire. We've been learning how Rome grew from a small city to one of the most powerful empires in history. Students are discovering how Roman inventions, like roads and aqueducts, helped connect their vast empire, and how Roman laws and government still influence us today. We've also explored the daily life of Roman citizens, from what they ate to the games they played. Ask your child about what surprised them most about ancient Rome—they've learned some amazing facts!

Science

In science class, our 6th graders are learning about force and motion. They are exploring how objects move and what causes them to start, stop, or change direction. Students are studying important ideas like gravity, friction, and Newton's Laws of Motion. They are also participating in simple experiments to observe how different forces affect motion. This unit helps students understand the science behind many things they experience in everyday life.

7TH GRADE

Social Studies:

Students will then begin Unit 5: The Constitution at Work. How early Presidents used the Constitution to improve the country's growth in the early years.

Bill of Rights

Amendment I

Congress shall make no law respecting an establishment of religion, or prohibiting the free exercise thereof; or abridging the freedom of speech, or of the press; or the right of the people peaceably to assemble, and to petition the Government for a redress of grievances.

Amendment II

A well regulated Militia, being necessary to the security of a free State, the right of the people to keep and bear Arms, shall not be infringed.

Amendment III

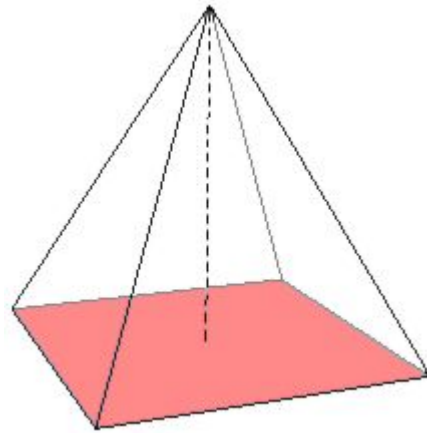
No Soldier shall, in time of peace be quartered in any house, without the consent of the Owner, nor in time of war, but in a manner to be prescribed by law.

Amendment IV

The right of the people to be secure in their persons, houses, papers, and effects, against unreasonable searches and seizures, shall not be violated, and no Warrants shall issue, but upon probable cause, supported by Oath or affirmation, and particularly describing the place to be searched, and the persons or things to be seized.

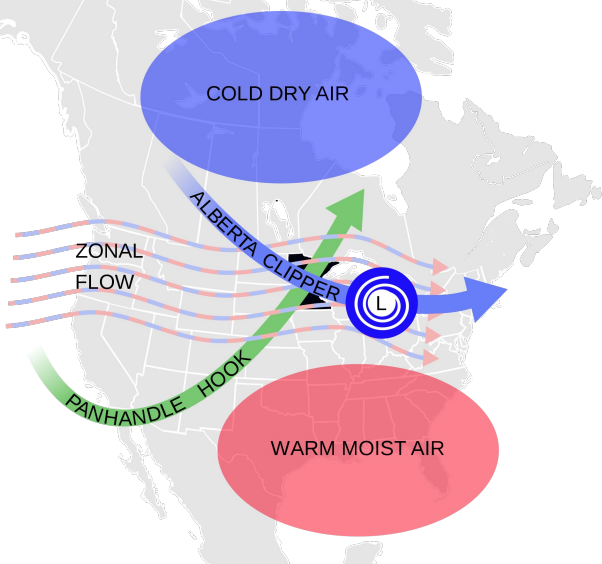
Math 7 Honors: Students are learning about Advanced Geometry.



Science:

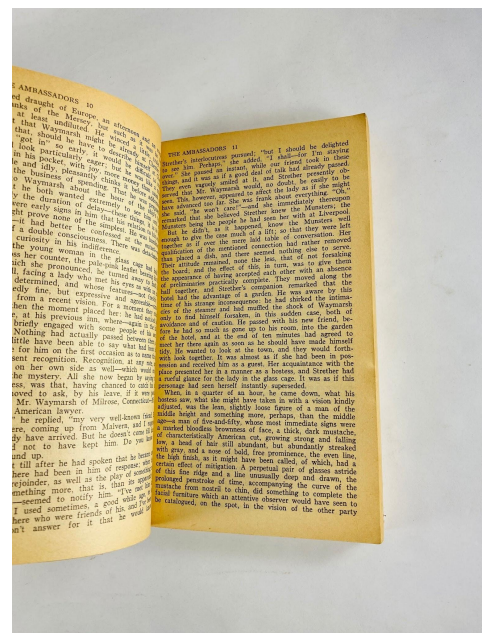
Students are learning about the weather patterns in the world and start the NYS investigation on weather.

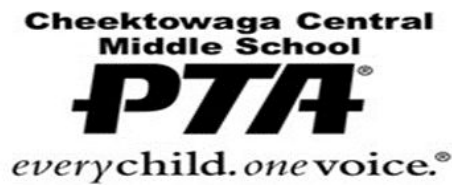
