Dear Parents/Guardians,

On behalf of the entire faculty and staff, it is my great pleasure to extend a warm welcome to Cheektowaga Central High School. Transitioning to high school can be both exciting and overwhelming. To help ease this transition and ensure a successful start to your child's high school experience, we have organized a ninth-grade orientation program that will occur this summer.

The orientation will take place at Cheektowaga Central High School from 7:45am to 10:15am, Monday-Thursday during one of the weeks listed below. Bussing to and from school will be provided along with breakfast. **Please click the link below to choose the Orientation week that works best for your schedule.** If you have not chosen a week by June 20th, your child will be assigned one.

Week 1: July 7 - July 10 Week 2: July 14 - July 17 Week 3: July 21 - July 24 Week 4: July 28 - July 31



The orientation program will provide your child with the opportunity to become acquainted with our school, meet some staff, tour the building and figure out their lockers. Students will participate in a variety of team and character building activities, while also having the opportunity to begin developing a digital portfolio that they will build upon over the course of the next four years. In addition, students will begin logging community service hours. It is a graduation requirement that students complete a total of twenty hours of community service between ninth and twelfth grade, so a head start is always helpful.

Ninth grade is a crucial year for our students and it is of utmost importance that they know what is expected of them and how these expectations differ from middle school. It is my experience that students who struggle in ninth grade and who do not earn the appropriate number of credits towards graduation, will struggle throughout their high school career. It is important that we work together as a team to ensure that our students are set up for success from day one. Here at Cheektowaga Central High School, we pride ourselves on our strong sense of community and want every student to feel supported, welcomed and included.

SPECIALS UPDATES



Middle school Physical Education classes concluded their third and final round of fitness testing for the school year this week. The purpose of fitness testing is to help students assess and understand their personal fitness levels in key areas related to overall health and physical development.

Students will dive into an exciting new unit on Ultimate Frisbee and Ultimate Football for the next few weeks. These dynamic, fast-paced team sports are excellent for developing cardiovascular endurance, hand-eye coordination, teamwork, and strategic thinking.

Ultimate Frisbee is a non-contact sport played with a flying disc/frisbee. The goal is to advance the disc down the field/court by passing it to teammates, aiming to catch it in the opposing team's end zone to score a point. Players may not run with the disc and must establish a pivot foot when holding it, similar to basketball. The game encourages respect, honesty, and good sportsmanship.

Ultimate Football follows similar principles but is played with a football instead of a frisbee. The focus remains on teamwork, fair play, and inclusive participation.

These games promote cooperation, communication, and physical fitness in a fun and engaging way. We're excited to watch students challenge themselves, build confidence, and enjoy the thrill of these unique sports!

Fifth-grade students Heidi Szyplman and Gia Persico creatively used their bodies to form each letter of the alphabet. This imaginative and physically engaging activity highlights both their teamwork and spatial awareness as they brought language to life through movement.
