Dignity for All Students Act

New York State's Dignity for All Students Act

(DASA/The Dignity Act) seeks to provide the State's public elementary and secondary school students with a safe and supportive environment, free from discrimination, intimidation, taunting, harassment and bullying on school property, a school bus and/or at a school function.

This legislation amended the State Education Law by creating a new Article 2-Dignity for All Students. The Dignity Act also amended Section 801-a of New York State Education Law regarding instruction in civility, citizenship, and character education by expanding the concepts of tolerance, respect for others and dignity to include: an awareness and sensitivity in the relations of people, including but not limited to, different races, weights, national origins, ethnic groups, religions, religious practices, mental or physical abilities, sexual orientations, gender identity, and sexes. The Dignity Act further amended Section 2801 of the Education Law by requiring Boards of Education to include language addressing The Dignity Act in their codes of conduct.

Excerpt from the 2018-19 Code of Conduct

It is the Student's Right to:

- 1. Be provided an education with appropriate educational opportunities.
- 2. Have the opportunity to be taught at his/her level of ability.
- 3. Be treated with dignity and respect by peers, teachers, and staff. Enjoy a positive school environment free of harassment, bullying or intimidation by both peers and teachers.
- 4. Approach school personnel with problems and concerns.
- 5. Have the opportunity to maintain his/her individuality without infringing on rights of others.
- Expect that the home and school will communicate and cooperate for his/her benefit.
- 7. Be afforded due process in the event of disciplinary action.
- 8. Be afforded choice of appropriate dress.
- 9. Have student records available for inspection by legal guardian upon request or by the student if 18 years of age.
- 10. Be represented by a student government as appropriate.
- 11. Be afforded the opportunity to participate in extracurricular activities.
- 12. Participate and/or be represented in the decision-making process, where appropriate.

It is the Student's Responsibility to:

- 1. Attend school daily, complete requirements to the best of his/her ability; be aware of & seek appropriate educational opportunities.
- 2. Make every effort to successfully complete the requirements in order to develop capabilities.
- 3. Respect the individual rights and property of self/others.
- 4. Be fair and honest in relating problems and concerns.
- 5. Respect individual differences.
- 6. Facilitate communication between home and school.
- 7. Be aware of rights, procedures and consequences.
- 8. Dress in a manner which does not endanger physical health, safety, limit participation in school activities or cause distraction to the teaching/learning environment.
- 9. Be aware of guidelines for access to student records.
- 10. Take an active part in student government.
- 11. Be aware of and abide by the rules and expectations governing participation and support these activities.
- 12. Participate or be represented in a manner which respects others' views.
