Some 5th grade homerooms participated in a team building activity. They had to move and stack cups without using any hands. Everyone had fun and nicely communicated in order to accomplish the task!




Where's the Beef...





Invention Convention...

Teamwork makes the Dreamwork...


This week, The Introduction to Law class worked on communication skills and team work with Lt. Schmidt.

Studio Art students are exploring color temperatures while creating an abstract design.




Let it Fly...




