

#### Make your time count...

Seeking District Residents Interested in Serving as Election Workers for the Annual District Budget & Trustee Vote

The Cheektowaga Central School District has begun preparing for its 2023-24 budget & trustee election which will be held on Tuesday, May 16, 2023, and it is seeking district residents to serve as poll workers for this vote. You are eligible to serve as a poll worker if you are a qualified voter and a resident of Cheektowaga Central School District. District employees, school board members, relatives of board members or candidates are <u>not</u> prohibited from serving as election workers.

The hours are from 11:00 am through the determination of the final results (typically 9:30 pm). In this paid (\$15.00/hr) role you will be responsible for:

- · Preparing the polling place for voting
- · Setting up the voting equipment
- · Processing the voters
- · Demonstrating voting procedures to the voters
- · Assisting voter if requested
- · Closing the polling place
- · Compiling and reporting the results

Note: Training will be provided
