English Language Arts in October is a flurry of activities, including connecting with students, discussing new readings, and crafting new writing.

Students in ELA 10 just finished discussing the novel *Long Way Down* by Jason Reynolds and are expanding their knowledge of writing strategies found on the ELA Regents Exam. By creating self-portrait poems, students are experimenting with writing from various perspectives. Next, students will be tackling the argument essay.

SUNY Erie students have just finished writing their college essays and descriptive writing projects. Next, they will read classic Halloween literature and write a college-level literary analysis. SUNY scholars are taking EN100 for three college credits.









This month Ms. Smith's Geometry class has been reviewing for our quarterly scrimmage through different activities including Gimkits and Blooket along with weekly homework tasks. Not only are we reviewing in our classes, we are also in the wonderful world of 2nd and 3rd dimension finding out areas and volumes of shapes and solids.





Students in the History of WNY class had the opportunity to check out the amazing architecture in downtown Buffalo. They started off in front of Buffalo City Hall and learned all about the art-



deco architecture and Native American symbolism throughout. Students walked across the street to Niagara Square and took in the McKinley Monument, the Statler and the old and new Courthouses. The walk continued to Old County Hall where

President McKinley laid in state after his death in 1901. Next stop on the tour was the Guaranty Building, which if you stand next to the building and look up you can see how the architects incorporated nature into the design. Across the street was St. Paul's Cathedral, which was built in 1907. Everyone had the opportunity to tour inside and see all of the beautiful architecture up close. The last stops on the walking tour were the Ellicott Square Building and Hotel Lafayette.




Students from Mr. Skotnicki's Advanced Engineering class took their rockets to Geneseo this past weekend to compete in the first round of the American Rocketry Challenge.
