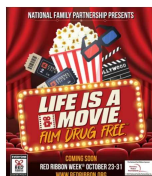


PRINCIPAL'S CORNER

The month of October has several events including National Red Ribbon Week. In 1985, DEA Special Agent Enrique “Kiki” Camarena was tortured and killed in Mexico. After his murder, parents & youth in communities across the country began wearing red ribbons as a symbol of their commitment to raise awareness of the destruction caused by drugs in America. In 1988, the National Family Partnership sponsored the first National Red Ribbon campaign and it has continued annually since. It serves as a catalyst to mobilize communities to educate youth about drugs. This year’s theme “**Life Is A Movie, Film Drug Free.**” was selected because it inspires individuals to play their part in fostering safe, healthy, and drug-free communities. From healthcare professionals to educators, parents, and beyond, the theme underscores the collective impact achievable through dedication and commitment. In Miss Brunner's algebra class, students work together in a "Number Trouble" scavenger hunt to find as many numbers as they can in 3 minutes starting at 1 consecutively to 100. They discussed good group work characteristics and collaboration.



Mr. Kelly's 9th grade global I students went hunting for artifacts. The 9th graders had a friendly competition to see which class could find the 20 artifacts hidden throughout the room the fastest. Biology - Miss Maggiore's students have been investigating characteristics of living things and cells. Students demonstrated their knowledge of cell organelles by making a model of a plant or animal cell using different kinds of candy.

Earth Science - Students are currently learning how to use latitude and longitude to locate things on maps. For example, they are using the location of shipwrecks in Lake Ontario to identify where those events occurred.

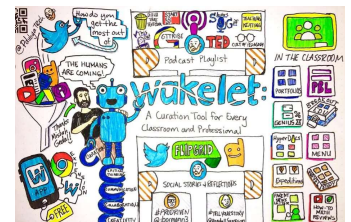
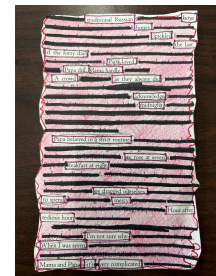
AP Biology - Students have been busy learning about ecology. They recently completed a population ecology lab where they applied formulas to determine population growth with and without a carrying capacity.



AP Literature - Students began their study of poetic devices by creating their own Blackout Poems, thanks to Ms. Lehner.

English 11 - Students participated in several Socratic Seminars in which they were responsible for generating intellectually stimulating discussions that allowed us to think critically about several works of short fiction.

All ELA students began designing and curating digital writing portfolios using Wakelet. These portfolios will follow them across all four years at Central.





Students in all levels of World Languages kicked off the school year by sharing information about themselves and getting to know their classmates. They worked on “leveling up” their writing skills by riveting **High Frequency Verbs** and implementing new vocabulary words.

French 4 and 5 spent time reviewing how to tell time the “old fashioned way”. They made paper plate analog clocks and used them in a variety of engaging activities.
