5th Grade Update

Math: Fifth grade math classes are deep into fractions. Students have been multiplying fractions with whole numbers and mixed numbers. We have been drawing diagrams to visually represent what is happening to build a deeper understanding of the process. Multiplication fact fluency is vitally important for success.

ELA: Half of the classes are continuing the Read Stop Write program partnered with the University of Buffalo. Students are learning skills to dissect non fiction texts. The rest of the fifth grade team is reading Holes and Shiloh and will be starting the Read Stop Write program in January.

Science: Classes are completing the Earth Systems unit and have learned about how all Earth systems interact. Students had the opportunity to isolate chemical reactions to produce a given outcome.

Social Studies: Classes are wrapping up their study of ancient civilizations of North and South America. They enjoyed learning about the Mayan, Inca and Aztecs. They will be beginning the unit on the Age of Exploration which will teach how a desire for simple goods like spices, helped to gain a better understanding of the entire world.









ELĀ

This month, our 6th graders are focusing on **reading comprehension**, with an emphasis on identifying **themes** and analyzing **text details**. These skills are crucial for understanding not just what a text says, but what it *means* and how the author conveys that meaning.

Identifying Themes: Students learn to determine the central message or lesson of a text by examining its main ideas and supporting details.

Text Analysis: We're encouraging students to dig deeper by analyzing how specific words, phrases, or events contribute to the overall meaning.

Social Studies

In our current unit, students are immersing themselves in the wonders of ancient Egypt. From the mighty Nile River to the iconic Pyramids of Giza, we are uncovering the mysteries of this captivating civilization.

Students are engaged in a variety of activities, including:

- Exploring the geography of Egypt and understanding the significance of the Nile River.
- Investigating the daily life of ancient Egyptians, from farming practices to social structures.
- Discovering the architectural marvels of the Pyramids and the Sphinx.
- Learning about the role of pharaohs and the fascinating process of mummification.

We encourage students to share their insights and discoveries with you. Consider asking your child about their favorite aspect of ancient Egypt or the most surprising fact they've learned so far.

Science

In their role as student thermal scientists, students work with the principal of Riverdale School, a fictional school, in order to help choose a new heater system. The principal is considering two proposed systems, both of which would use water to heat the school.

These systems differ in important ways. How these two systems work serves as the anchor phenomenon for this unit and the explanations students make allow them to make a recommendation to the principal. To understand heating and cooling, students will go beyond intuition to discover that observed temperature changes can be explained by the movement of molecules, which facilitates the transfer of kinetic energy from one place to another. Students will use the Thermal Energy simulation to understand the connection between molecule movement and temperature. Students will also understand how energy is transferred from one object to another. All of the knowledge gained in this unit will help the student to determine their recommendation for which heating system is best for Riverdale School.

Math

This month we started our unit on ratio relationships. We kicked off our exploration by building a solid foundation of what ratios are and how they work. Students grasped the concept of expressing relationships between quantities and gained a deeper understanding ratio tables and equivalence. One of the more interesting aspects of learning ratios is realizing their prevalence in our daily lives. From sharing snacks with friends to dividing ingredients in recipes, students discovered that ratios are all around us. At home, recipes are a great way to review ratio relationships in real life situations. Doubling, tripling and even halving recipes bring the concept of equivalent ratios to life!





Social Studies:



Students are finishing up the class novel The Giver and rewrite their own ending to the novel to represent the theme.





Important Announcements

Here are some key updates from our classes as we near the holiday break:

- **Social Studies:** We will soon finish our unit on Westward Expansion and transition into our study of immigration in the United States.
- **Math 8:** Students will conclude their exploration of the Pythagorean Theorem and begin learning about slope. Additionally, we will be taking our 4th benchmark assessment before the break.
- **Algebra:** The focus will be on functions, specifically discussing range, domain, absolute value functions, and piecewise functions. We will also take our 4th benchmark assessment soon.

- **General 8th Grade Science:** We are completing the New York State investigation "It's Alive," which compares characteristics of living and non-living things. Following this, we will begin a new unit on genetics and reproduction.
- **Biology:** We will kick off our unit titled "Humans vs. Bacteria," focusing on the effects of microscopic organisms on the human body.
- **ELA:** Students will participate in Read, Stop, Write, and read the World War II novel *Unbroken*. Our continued emphasis will be on reading comprehension and test preparation.






Eric Rawls Shines as a Team Player in PE Class

National Junior Honor Society



The National Junior Honor Society (N.J.H.S.) is the nation's premier organization established to recognize outstanding middle school students. More than just an honor roll, N.J.H.S. serves to honor those students who have demonstrated excellence in the areas of Scholarship, Leadership, Service, Character and Citizenship. These characteristics have been associated with membership in the organization since its beginning in 1929. The purpose of N.J.H.S. is to create enthusiasm for scholarship, to stimulate a desire to render service, to promote leadership, to develop character, and to encourage citizenship. The Cheektowaga Central Middle School Chapter of the N.J.H.S. is administered by Mrs. Lynnae Kwilas, the induction process is demanding and the selection process is extremely difficult.

How do you become a member?

#At Cheektowaga students are considered for membership when they are 2nd semester 7th or 8th graders.

#Students must have a semester cumulative grade point average of 93% (This includes 6th grade). #Students must demonstrate excellence in character, scholarship, leadership, service, and citizenship.

What are the membership expectations?:

#Maintain a minimum grade point average of 93%

#Demonstrate character, leadership, citizenship, and service

#Attend all meetings and participate in group service projects

What is the selection process?:

Step 1: If students qualify academically for the N.J.H.S., they are notified in February. To be considered for membership, students must fill out the information sheet, and write an essay.

Step 2: The teachers and staff at Cheektowaga provide feedback about students who are seeking membership. They are asked to comment on the students' strengths and weaknesses in the areas of character, leadership, service, and citizenship.

Step 3: A Faculty Council is assembled to review the information sheets, essays, and staff recommendations. When reviewing candidates, the Faculty Council will not have the names of the candidates while making the decision for membership. The actual selection of new members must be made by a <u>majority vote of the five appointed members of the Faculty Council</u>. With the vote on each candidate, those candidates receiving a <u>majority vote of the faculty council</u> should be invited for induction into the chapter.

Step 4: Formal notification of all selected and non-selected candidates and their parents will be done with a letter by the chapter advisor to inform them about selection and the timing of the induction ceremony.

The N.J.H.S. The Selection Process as outlined above conforms to the national guidelines, is applied fairly and consistently to ALL candidates, and provides a meaningful recognition of deserving students. Please be on the lookout this February for more information.
