

GREETINGS FROM 5th GRADE: HAPPY NEW YEAR!

Math:

Students are continuing their work with fractions. Multiplying fractions and mixed numbers are the latest skills being worked on. It is imperative that all students know multiplication facts.

Science:

Students are finishing up the unit on Earth systems and are beginning a unit on Matter. During this new unit, students play the role of food scientists and will help develop a food with given characteristics. They will be thinking about matter at the molecular level and completing investigations to understand the properties of molecules.

Social Studies:

The classes are finishing up their unit on the Incas and will be starting the Age of Exploration. This new unit will focus on explorers and how their desire for spices helped to map our world.


Social Studies:

Students will begin Unit 3: The American Revolution, they will learn the causes, key battles and outcomes of the American Revolution.










Honors Math: Students will be learning about percentages and solving equations.




English:

Important Announcements

We have several exciting topics and units coming up in the next few weeks:

- Social Studies: Our focus will be on Immigration to America, the American Industrial Revolution, and the
 Progressive Era. We will explore the challenges of the Industrial Revolution and discuss how society worked to
 fix these issues.
- Math 8: We will be starting our unit on linear equations, where students will learn to solve and graph lines in the form of (y = mx + b).
- **Algebra 8 (Honors)**: Students will dive into systems of equations and inequalities, enhancing their problem-solving skills.
- English Language Arts (ELA): We are wrapping up the Read Stop Write program for 8B, while 8A will be beginning this program. Additionally, 8B will start our World War II unit and read the book *Unbroken*.
- **8th Grade Science**: We will explore Amplify units on traits and reproduction, studying how traits are passed from parents to offspring using spiders as our primary organisms and computer simulations.
- **Honors Biology**: Beginning in January, we will enter the Ecology Unit, focusing on how living organisms interact with each other and their physical environments.
- **Spanish 8**: Our eighth-grade Spanish students will be wrapping up their clothing unit after the break, with a unit test scheduled before the end of quarter one.




Students in the Middle School Technology class learning to program the basics of Python code in Skillstruck.
