

Social Studies Update: Wrapping Up Ancient Rome and Moving Forward

Our 6th graders are finishing their exciting unit on Ancient Rome! They've explored the rise and fall of the Roman Empire, learned about influential leaders like Julius Caesar and Augustus, and discovered how Roman innovations continue to shape our world today. As we wrap up, students are reflecting on what they've learned through projects and discussions. Next, we'll begin our new unit on early Islamic settlements, where students will explore the beginnings of Islam, important cultural contributions, and the growth of major cities and trade routes. It's a great time to ask your child about what they've learned — and what they're looking forward to next!

Science Spotlight: Investigating Mixtures

In science, our 6th graders are learning all about mixtures — combinations of two or more substances that are not chemically combined. Students have been exploring the properties of mixtures and are using hands-on experiments to separate them using methods like filtration, evaporation, and magnetism. These interactive activities help students see science in action and deepen their understanding of how mixtures are part of our everyday lives. Ask your child about the mixtures they've worked with and the creative ways they've separated them!

Math Update: Moving Forward After State Testing

Our 6th graders have worked hard and shown great focus preparing fot the state test — we're so proud of their effort and perseverance! When testing is behind us, we're excited to dive into our next math unit on statistics and graphing. Students will learn how to collect, organize, and interpret data, and they'll create different types of graphs such as bar graphs, line plots, and histograms. This unit is a fun and practical way for students to see how math connects to the real world.

ELA Update: Diving into *The Lightning Thief*!


Now that the New York State tests are complete, our 6th graders are jumping into an exciting new novel: *The Lightning Thief* by Rick Riordan! This adventurous story follows Percy Jackson as he discovers his true identity and embarks on an epic journey filled with Greek mythology, mystery, and action. As we read, students will work on building their reading comprehension skills, discussing character development, and making connections between mythology and modern storytelling. Encourage your child to talk about the adventures of Percy in the book compared to the movie. Riordan's book is full of excitement and important lessons!


ELA:

This month classes are studying the novel *Roll of Thunder, Hear my Cry* by Mildred Taylor. Students will create a character playlist to represent the characters in the novel!




Science:
