#### 5th Grade November News

We are pleased to welcome Miss Leitten to the fifth grade team. She is a special educational teacher working with our students.

Daily routines help all students succeed. Please continue to review and sign your child's agenda daily.

Here are some updates from the fifth grade classrooms

#### Math:

Students have learned the relationship between a fraction and a division statement. They have modeled division expressions with diagrams and have begun to multiply fractions and mixed numbers. These concepts require mastery of basic multiplication facts. All students are expected to know their multiplication facts instantly without counting on their fingers. If they do not, they need daily practice at home. We thank you for your investment of time with your child.

#### Science:

Students have studied the water cycle at both the observable level and the nanoscale. They have written scientific explanations using new vocabulary that describes what is happening with molecules as water changes form.

#### Social Studies:

Students are enjoying learning about the Mayans, Aztec and Incas. These early American civilizations had unique customs and traditions. These cultures demonstrated a strong understanding of mathematics, engineering, and astronomy that is evidenced in their artifacts.

#### **English Language Arts:**

Students are in the middle of their book study unit. They are reading and enjoying <u>Holes</u> or <u>Shiloh</u>. Ask your child who their favorite character is. Reading at home daily with your child is a great way to build vocabulary and comprehension skills.



Dear 6th Grade Families,

In **Social Studies** our 6th-grade students recently embarked on an exciting journey into ancient Mesopotamia, diving into the rich culture and history of the Sumerians. They explored why this "land between rivers" was ideal for early civilization, fostering innovations like the wheel, cuneiform writing, and advanced irrigation systems that supported thriving cities. Students learned about Sumerian society's complexity, from organized city structures with towering ziggurats to the development of early mathematics and trade networks that extended across regions. This immersive journey sparked curiosity and appreciation for one of the world's first civilizations and its lasting impact on human history.

Science our 6th graders are learning about the fascinating world of harnessing human energy, exploring how the body generates, uses, and conserves energy for everyday tasks! As they learn about different types of energy—such as kinetic, potential, thermal, and chemical—they're discovering how these forms power everything from body movements to the technology around us. Discussions cover renewable energy sources like solar and wind, along with innovative technologies for sustainable living. Through experiments and hands-on activities, students are gaining insights into energy transfer, conservation, and the impact of energy choices, fostering a deeper appreciation for the many types of energy that keep our world in motion.

**Math** our 6th graders have been mastering the art of dividing fractions and mixed numbers! They've been learning how to break down complex problems, using strategies to simplify division between fractions and convert mixed numbers when necessary. By exploring real-world scenarios, students are developing a strong grasp of how and when to apply these skills practically, building confidence with each problem they solve. This foundational math skill not only strengthens their number sense but also prepares them for more advanced concepts in the future. It's exciting to see their enthusiasm as they tackle and conquer these new challenges in math!

**ELA** our 6th grade ELA students have been expanding their reading skills by diving into a variety of genres, including informative texts, poetry, and nonfiction passages. As they explore these different styles, students are learning to identify main ideas, analyze text structure, and understand the author's purpose across various forms of writing. From interpreting factual information to uncovering themes in poetry and real-life stories, they're building critical reading skills that deepen comprehension and analytical thinking. It's wonderful to see their engagement as they connect with each text and broaden their perspectives through diverse reading

experiences!




### **Social Studies:**


### English:

#### Science:


Students are learning about how the plate motion and how the plates move around the earth.

#### HOW TO REGISTER FOR A TRAVELOGS INTERNATIONAL INC. TRIP

This code will allow you to enroll online and pay the initial deposit/registration fee using a major credit card.

1) Go to <a href="www.travelogsinternational.com">www.travelogsinternational.com</a> and click on "Register For Your Trip." This will direct you to a page that is entitled "Register or Login To Your Account". Once you're on this page, there will be two empty boxes, one for a registration code and one for an e mail address. Enter your group's registration code and your e-mail address. This e-mail address will be used to make future payment(s) for the trip. Please be sure to use an e-mail address that is checked frequently. Click on "Create My Account."

Please make sure that if you have had a child that has traveled on previous trips with your school and you already have an


account created with Travelogs, you can log into that account and (if needed) "add additional traveler" to your already-existing account linked with your particular e-mail.

- 2) Once an account has been created, an e-mail will be automatically sent to you with a link and a temporary password.
- 3) Click on the link within your e-mail and you'll automatically be directed back to the "Log Into Your Account" page. Enter your e-mail and the temporary password. Click "Log In" when complete.
- 4) You will now be on a page that will show the information for the trip in which you would like to register for. Click on the "View Trip Details and Register for This Trip" link.
- 5) You will now be on the school's trip website. In order to complete the registration process, scroll down to the bottom of the page and choose the option of how to register.
- 6) Once you click on your option, you'll then be directed to the "Manage Your Profile Page." Complete all of the necessary information and hit "Save."
- 7) Lastly, you'll be taken to a page that requires three checked boxes and a place for a parent/guardian to sign his/her name acknowledging and accepting Travelogs' terms and conditions. Once that is completed, click on "Process Registration."
  - a. For **credit card users**: you will then receive an e-mail confirmation that the deposit has been processed. Your registration is now complete.
  - b. For those who choose the "pay by mail" option: your registration on the trip is pending upon receipt of your required deposit. Once the "Manage Profile" page is completed, you will be e-mailed an invoice for your deposit. Please print out a copy of this invoice, and mail it along with your check or money order to

Travelogs. This deposit must be received no later than the deposit deadline set by your son/daughter's teacher. Failure to do so will result in automatic removal from the trip.
