


Picture Retake Day

Dear 5th Grade Families,

With the school year in full force, we would like to provide some reminders of fifth grade expectations. We begin our school day at 8am. Please make sure that your child arrives on time for school. All students should be writing in their agendas daily. We ask that parents sign the agendas daily and ask to see completed homework that is assigned. Please make sure that your child has pencils for school daily.

Math

In math, students have completed the unit on volume. They should be practicing their multiplication facts daily. Students have math homework assigned daily.

Science

In science, students are continuing the unit on Earth Systems. They have learned about the water cycle and what happens on a molecular level as water changes phases. This work will help them take on the role of a water resource engineer to solve a water shortage problem on the fictitious Ferris Island.


Social Studies

Students learned all about maps and created their own maps using their new skills. Students look forward to learning about the regions of the United States and early civilizations form each region.


<u>ELA</u>

All classes have started weekly spelling lists. Students should be bringing home weekly spelling words and spelling homework. They can expect a weekly spelling test. ELA classes have also begun novels. Please ask your child about the book they are reading in class.









Dear 6th Grade Families

Spotlight on Science and Social Studies: As we dive deeper into our exciting school year, our 6th graders are tackling some hands-on projects and intriguing subjects across both science and social studies! Here's a glimpse of what your students have been up to.

Science: Hand-Crank Generators & Battery Generators-In science class, students are learning about energy, electricity, and how we can generate power in various ways. To bring these concepts to life, students have been building hand-crank generators and battery-powered generators.

Through these hands-on projects, students explore:

- **Mechanical energy**: Using a hand crank, they convert physical motion into electrical energy.
- **Electric circuits**: They're building simple circuits and understanding how electricity flows to power small devices.
- Renewable vs. non-renewable energy: The difference between generating power manually (renewable) and using stored energy from a battery (non-renewable) is highlighted.

These projects not only reinforce their understanding of basic physics but also allow them to experiment with the concepts of power generation in a real-world context!

Social Studies: The 5 Fields of Study-In social studies, we're exploring the five key fields that help us understand the world around us:

- 1. **History**: Students are diving into the past, learning about significant events, cultures, and people who shaped our world.
- 2. **Geography**: Understanding our planet's physical features and how they affect human activity is key. Students are learning to read maps and explore different regions.
- 3. **Economics**: We're discussing how economies work, including the role of money, trade, and resources in societies, past and present.
- 4. **Government**: Exploring the basics of government structures, laws, and how citizens engage in civic life is helping students understand their role in society.
- 5. **Culture**: This field focuses on the beliefs, customs, art, and traditions that make societies unique.

Through these five fields, our students are gaining a holistic view of how the world works, connecting the past with the present, and exploring how societies are structured.

Looking Ahead- Both our science and social studies units encourage critical thinking, problem-solving, and a deeper understanding of the world. Be sure to ask your child about their generator project or a favorite historical figure—they're learning a lot and love sharing their discoveries!

Social Studies:

Students will Finish Unit 1: Native Americans and how they adapted to their environment (including geography, early people and migration to the USA) with a concentration on the NYS Tribe, the Iroquois.

Students will then Start Unit 2: 13 Colonies and continue through November.






Math:


Math 7 students are learning about probability.

English:

This month, students are studying elements of plot through spooky short stories. Students will read a variety of texts and create a plot diagram poster!



Science:

Students will finish Unit 1: Geology on Mars, studying landscapes, weather and formation of the planet Mars.



Welcome to October 8th Grade

Summer is firmly in the rearview mirror and we have now moved into the season of leaves falling from the trees in an array of beautiful colors, pumpkin spice, ghouls and goblins, and all things October. This also means we are now firmly into the second month of school. It is the hope of the 8th grade teachers that the start of the school year has been a good one for your son or daughter.

In social studies the Unit of the War on Terror has ended and classes now move into Reconstruction Unit. The Reconstruction Unit is the period immediately following the end of the Civil War and starts with the assassination of President Abraham Lincoln. This will move through the presidencies of President Andrew Johnson and President Ulysses S. Grant.

In mathematics students will be finishing up exponents by studying square and cubed roots. We will then start our unit on transformations. In September students focused on rational and irrational numbers as well exponents and their properties. Also students will be using the IXL computer program to reinforce skills learned in the classroom. In algebra students will be starting Unit 3, which dives into data and different ways to represent data such as histograms, box plots, and scatter plots. We will also investigate different measures of center and variability.

In all ELA classes students are reading the classic book the *Outsider* by SE Hinton. ELA students have weekly spelling and vocabulary lists. Students have also been working on honing their skills with identifying finding the main idea and supporting details in articles.

Science is continuing to study how antibiotics and other treatments (fecal transplants) impact the human gut microbiome. In living environment students will continue to study the mystery about why the marathon runner collapsed.

In Spanish, the first unit called *Mucho Gusto* has been wrapped up. Students will now be starting the new topic *Le Salud* during the month of October. A primary focus will also be on reviewing body parts, illnesses and remedies. In Spanish the month of October will close out with the third unit called Dia de los Muertos.

Thank you to both 8th grade parents and students. This has been an amazing start to the school year. Both teachers and administrators in the Middle School appreciate your support. HOW TO REGISTER FOR A TRAVELOGS INTERNATIONAL INC. TRIP

This code will allow you to enroll online and pay the initial deposit/registration fee using a major credit card.

1) Go to www.travelogsinternational.com and click on "Register For Your Trip." This will direct you to a page that is entitled "Register or Login To Your Account". Once you're on this page, there will be two empty boxes, one for a registration code and one for an e mail address. Enter your group's registration code and your e-mail address. This e-mail address will be used to make future payment(s) for the trip. Please be sure to use an e-mail address that is checked frequently. Click on "Create My Account."

Please make sure that if you have had a child that has traveled on previous trips with your school and you already have an

account created with Travelogs, you can log into that account and (if needed) "add additional traveler" to your already-existing account linked with your particular e-mail.

- 2) Once an account has been created, an e-mail will be automatically sent to you with a link and a temporary password.
- 3) Click on the link within your e-mail and you'll automatically be directed back to the "Log Into Your Account" page. Enter your e-mail and the temporary password. Click "Log In" when complete.
- 4) You will now be on a page that will show the information for the trip in which you would like to register for. Click on the "View Trip Details and Register for This Trip" link.
- 5) You will now be on the school's trip website. In order to complete the registration process, scroll down to the bottom of the page and choose the option of how to register.
- 6) Once you click on your option, you'll then be directed to the "Manage Your Profile Page." Complete all of the necessary information and hit "Save."
- 7) Lastly, you'll be taken to a page that requires three checked boxes and a place for a parent/guardian to sign his/her name acknowledging and accepting Travelogs' terms and conditions. Once that is completed, click on "Process Registration."
 - a. For **credit card users**: you will then receive an e-mail confirmation that the deposit has been processed. Your registration is now complete.
 - b. For those who choose the "pay by mail" option: your registration on the trip is pending upon receipt of your required deposit. Once the "Manage Profile" page is completed, you will be e-mailed an invoice for your deposit. Please print out a copy of this invoice, and mail it along with your check or money order to

Travelogs. This deposit must be received no later than the deposit deadline set by your son/daughter's teacher. Failure to do so will result in automatic removal from the trip.
